Application Deadline for Youth Heifer Nov. 8

2025 donation heifer to be presented at the 52nd National Show in Denver. Colorado

Photos submitted must be 8" x 10", color and mounted. There are three classes: Candid, Scenic and Cattle. The junior photographer can submit up to six entries, with no more than two entries per class. List your name and age on the back of the photo.

Heartland Challenge

To be eligible for the Heartland Challenge, participants must compete in at least three of the following contests:

Marketing, Quiz Bowl, Photo, Speech and Showmanship. Contestants competing in at least three of the qualifying contests are automatically in contention for the award.





PEYTON VOLKMAN

Peyton Volkman, Cut Bank, Montana is the 2024 recipient of the North American South Devon Association youth experience heifer, donated by C/N Ranch, Carroll & Carole Nelson, Big Timber, Montana.

Peyton completed an application detailing his skills, ability and desire to raise, care for and learn about the breed. He shared his goals and experience in the 4-H market beef project and submitted two letters of recommendation as to his character and ability to care for the heifer. "I looked into the breed, what they'd need to live a good life and thought they'd fit well here," he said. "I was interested in the breed."

"I was really excited. I was pretty stoked to hear I won," Peyton said. He plans to AI his heifer this spring with hopes of raising a replacement heifer or 4-H steer for the Marias Fair and adding her to his growing herd of cows.

"Peyton has a willingness to learn and desire to learn more about the beef cattle industry and livestock production. He consistently attends any beef cattle related workshop or training related to livestock judging," said Kari Lewis, Glacier County extension agent. Whether it's calving cows, vaccinating calves, shipping, seeding, spraying, haying, or harvesting, Peyton is an integral part of all the facets of production on his family's ranch.

"I'm interested in learning about the South Devon breed precisely because, in northern Montana, we sometimes have very rough conditions, and the South Devon breed would do better in this climate than some other breeds. I would also like to meet other breeders associated with the South Devon breed," he said. "With the South Devon being a high-marbling breed, I will raise her steer calf as a 4-H calf and keep her heifers for replacement heifers."
