

The Spectrum of Challenge and Progress

What a time for beef producers! The cow calf sector boasts record prices, the demand for beef is sky high, and the cliff doesn't seem eminent. My hope this next year is for all membership to drive toward the overarching goal of moving our diverse association forward to market both our cattle and our people. My thoughts as we approach this task and the next year of production cycles, stem from both sides of a fence with individual definitions of challenge and progress.



Everyone reading this right now has your own agenda, your own cattle and your own aspirations. Do not let anyone besides yourself and those with a vested interest in your operation dictate what progress means to you. Simply getting to one more show this year and coming home placing higher than last year, or selling more bulls, we each have our own pursuits. I would ask that you take some time to ponder challenges of other operations. Our breed covers the whole spectrum of producers from large commercial operations to those that produce and develop purebred seedstock. However, the largest portion of our membership is made up of those with less than 50 registered cows. My show heifer eating all the feed today is not high on the list during calving season for 200 head; and copping together equipment to take your first heifer to the fair is something many of us scarcely remember. To move forward as an association, it will take the empathy from both sides of that fence as we pursue progress as a breed beyond each individual.

Many see our size and diversity as a challenge, my hope is we turn that challenge into progress. Our mobility through communication and diversity of our producers

should be an asset, not fodder for stalemates. Representation of ideas and cattle from producers that have five head is just as important as that of folks who make their living with registered cattle. The definitions of success from both sides of that fence need to be represented under our umbrella of progress. What's stopping us from utilizing that 'challenge' to build a welcoming, diverse association where everyone has a seat at the table? That's progress.

Another 'challenge' we face is growth and development. Of our people, our cattle, our genetics and the foundations that keep it all together (the association). From the association perspective, it's hard not to be excited about growth and development for the upcoming year. The quality of our cattle continues to improve, the rest of this book speaks to that. The quality of our cattle from a genetic perspective is continuing to improve the relevance of our breed nationwide. Our association is now operating with an online platform that will facilitate registrations, and the ease of data sharing. That ability has a two-fold impact, 1) increasing the number of registrations and membership, 2) strengthening the database that gives us relevance industry wide.

Let's all continue to build our programs around our own definition of 'progress' while keeping in mind the 'challenges' of all members as we move forward this year. Don't shy away from the idea that we are capable of spinning the challenge into progress that is as unique and exciting as every one of our producers from coast to coast!

In order to calculate more accurate indexes, NASDA is encouraging members to record body condition scores and cow weights. The Beef Improvement Federation has recommended guidelines and best practices and the best time to record a BCS is at weaning. A .50 rebate will be given by NASDA to members for each BCS turned in.

THE TERPSTRA FAMILY

NEW SHARON, IOWA

When opportunities arise, they often lead down paths you never expected. For Dan Terpstra, South Devons were just that, and it was an impactful decision that has shaped their operation. He had always wanted to run a cow-calf operation, but it was never in the cards as he and his family were already busy with the grain farm and jobs.

When his son Wyatt, was of 4-H age, the family was out selecting show pigs when a bred Red Angus cow at the same location caught Terpstra's attention. This female was the foundation of their herd, and it grew from there, a few females at a time.

Red Angus served as the foundation of the operation for several years, but the Terpstra's were looking to shift the direction of their herd and began exploring cross-breeding options. "We were searching for easy keepers with superior maternal traits," said Terpstra.

A conversation at the Iowa State Fair resolved the search when Terpstra spoke with South Devon producer and neighbor, Jordan Vander Molen, of JVM Cattle Co. He recommended the family try a South Devon bull on their females, and Terpstra agreed.

When the first crossbred calf crop hit the ground, Terpstra's were pleased with the results. Red Angus and South Devon proved to be a successful cross for fellow producers and was now impacting Lower Grove Farm. The calving ease was one of the many things Terpstra was impressed by. They started keeping back cross females to expand their herd. "They had all the qualities that matter to us," said Terpstra. Continued improvement in calving ease, soundness, milking abilities, efficiency and docility continued to impact the herd.

Currently, Lower Grove Farm consists of South Devon and Red Angus cross females, with a few purebred Red Angus. A large percentage of the herd are bred to South Devon genetics, either via artificial insemination or natural breeding.

Looking ahead, Terpstra said they're focusing on herd expansion in the next years, emphasizing they are "growing without sacrificing quality." To further advance their genetics, flushing some of their top-end females is on the horizon. With herd expansion comes more space, and the family is utilizing parts of their row-crop farm to turn to pasture. On this farm, they put up their own hay to provide for the cattle side of the operation.

Lower Grove genetics have been seen across the state, with their cattle shown at various shows, some being county fairs, the Iowa State Fair, and the National Western Stock Show in Denver, Colorado. Although the family doesn't exhibit cattle themselves, Terpstra said, "It's always a proud moment when you have animals do well at shows." Promoting their genetics in the ring and to other producers drives their growing customer basis.

Females not kept back in their herd are sold as replacements or bred heifers, and some bulls and feeder steers are marketed as well. Terpstra said, “When someone says they want to buy what we’re doing, it’s confirmation we’re headed in the right direction.”

Lower Grove Farm is continually progressive, not only in its livestock and farming practices, but also through its family-run business, RP America, which focuses on commercial 3D printer sales, service, materials, and parts production. With RP America located on the farm, the family can shift roles moving between barn and business as needed.

Managing the cows, the crops, and the business truly takes the entire family. Terpstra, alongside his wife Deb and their four children, has shaped this multifaceted operation into what it is today. Wyatt serves as farm manager, while his wife Emma is a pharmacist at a local hospital, and contributes any chance she gets, especially with newborn calves on the farm. Their daughter, Stella Johnson, leads RP America’s parts production center, but is always ready to pitch in on the farm, while her husband, Brodey, works across areas of both the farm and the business. Their other children, Rhett Terpstra, and daughter Ivy Louters and her husband, Bryce, all currently working on large dairy operations out of state, have also been instrumental contributors to the farm, even when they are not close to home. “From

the very beginning, it’s been a family affair,” Dan said. Whether working with cows, crops, or advancing the family business, the Terpstra family remains diligent and dedicated in all they do.

Families like the Terpstra’s don’t often receive recognition, so Vander Molen jumped on the opportunity to change that for the family he guided into the South Devon breed. “They’re really humble, down-to-earth people that deserve a bit of recognition,” said Vander Molen, “They don’t need to be in the highlights.” Lower Grove Farm was honored and surprised to be awarded Commercial Producer of the Year. Dan said, “It’s extra special on a different level because it speaks to our program and efforts.”

For Walnut Grove Farm, South Devons have always been a family affair. What began as a trip to the 2004 National Western Stock Show in Denver, Colorado to watch Three Cedar Farms (TCF) exhibit cattle turned to an opportunity that sparked the Steinlicht's interest. Their son, Garrett, age 3 at the time, stepped into the ring for the first time, alongside his great-uncle Harry. Many spectators gathered to watch the young showman exhibit a newborn calf next to its mother, a heifer intended to show as a bred, that had calved a few days before the show. Harry was showing the heifer but needed a showman for the calf, so he asked Garrett.

"After helping in Denver 2004, we were hooked," says Stephanie. The family bought their first South Devon female in the same year and their son became a junior member of the North American South Devon Association (NASDA). From then on, they began attending junior nationals every year

and continued to expand their herd with the guidance of Stephanie's uncles at TCF. In 2008, the family branched out to their own operation, buying most of their South Devon cows from a dispersal sale in partnership with Butterfly Acres, Stephanie's mother and stepfather Carol and John Wilken. They chose to continue pursuing South Devons as they appreciated their docility, especially with Garrett and their daughter, Ciera, both being young showman. Mike and Stephanie did not want to pass on the opportunity of being part of the great people and cattle within the association.

Today, the family runs a smaller herd, managing predominantly purebred South Devons as well as Poundmakers and purebred Red

Angus. The docility is a driving factor for their operation, producing high-quality and well-mannered animals for potential show stock. The Steinlichts have built their genetics to align with their preferences in cattle, breeding for more moderate and structurally sound females achieving this by outside sires and artificial insemination. They believe the breed truly works in combination with any other breed, most notably Red Angus and Shorthorns in their operation.

Ciera now handles most of the breeding decisions, utilizing various matings to improve their herd genetics. "We strive to make champions that are even better cows," says Ciera. The family has seen many successes in the show ring throughout the children's show careers.

The Steinlichts believe the South Devon breed works well in combination with any breed, including the Red Angus and Shorthorns in their operation.

This on top of being named Seedstock Producer of the Year were both recent highlights for the family. Stephanie says, “We are proud every time we are able to be together as a family and enjoy everything we have been able to accomplish.”

Walnut Grove’s genetics are efficient in and out of the show ring. They have also built a customer base for home raised beef, keeping back a few steers each year to feed for this purpose. South Devon’s high feeding efficiency is impactful, especially in this sector of the operation.

The family markets their home-raised beef, show calves via private treaty and sires to local families, fellow producers, and young showmen. Stephanie remarks that, “There is no better recognition than when people want to buy your genetics to make their own.”

Connections with these customers and fellow South Devon breeders are highly valued by the Steinlicht family. It is often said in any sector of the beef industry that the best part is

With all parts of the family active in the junior association and Mike and Stephanie having full-time jobs, running the farm takes everybody. Garrett assumes full responsibilities with the family’s feed and crops. Stephanie handles record-keeping and marketing, until this year, when Ciera started taking on these tasks. The cattle care, breeding decisions, and show stock are all managed by Ciera and Mike. Ultimately, everything is done as a family. “They symbolize what being a South Devon person is all about,” says Vander Molen.

MJB Ranch

LODGE GRASS, MONTANA

The legacy of the MJB Ranch South Devon program lives on through the individuals who purchased females from their retirement sale. MJB Montana 4519M was crowned Grand Champion South Devon Female at the recent 2026 National South Devon Show, held at the National Western Stock Show in Denver, Colorado. Owned by Ciera Steinlicht, Valley Falls, Kansas, the heifer was purchased from the MJB retirement sale group of females. Other breeders showcased cattle sired by MJB genetics, including MJB Legacy 328L and MJB NFL 953G.

It had been thirty-five years since Jim and Mary Brown first brought South Devon blood to the Montana ranch and since then, the MJB Ranch became prominent within the breed and continues to do so through genetics passed on to multiple breeders across the U.S. In addition to winning bull test awards, champions in the showing and success in the breeding pasture they were also honored by the association with a Lifetime Achievement Award and recently inducted into the Hall of Fame this past January.

“I had a partner in some Salers cattle, a fella the name of Dar Giess, and he had a South Devon cow that he was pretty proud of,” Brown says. “She looked pretty good and he talked me into buying her.”

Brown says he never looked back and went to buying South Devon cattle from several places including Scott Bollenbach, Leachman Cattle Company, Jack Dahl and of course, Dar Giess.

“Basically, when we found a bull that we liked, we bought him,” he says.

They had been looking for a gentle breed with pigmented udders after struggling to keep up with sunburned udders on the Herefords that they had been running. The South Devon cattle seemed to be gentle and about as productive as the Herefords, but over the years Brown had been impressed with how well the breed continued to perform both in the pasture and on the rail.

“We’re pretty much performance oriented,” he says. “The first thing they’ve got to be is right at birth, they’ve got to be fertile and functional, they have to have enough

muscling and be sound and be good converters on the range, but if they don’t eat good, they’re not much.”

Through selling quite a bit of locker beef over the years, the Browns have found that after most people try the South Devon beef, they have a hard time buying anything else because of its unique flavor.

“It’s nothing we did, but the cattle we put together have turned out to be very efficient and efficiency is profitable,” Brown says. “If they convert to beef on less pounds of grain than something else can, it’s pretty hard to beat.”

MJB Ranch was the longest running consignor to Midland Bull Test in Columbus, Mont., the largest feed efficiency testing program in North America, where, after the consigned bulls are submitted to a 120-day test, the top 80 percent are sold in the Final Sort Sale in April.

“Midland started testing for efficiency and these cattle turned out to have it just bred into them,” Brown says. “It really wasn’t anything we selected for or anything else, they just turned out to be very efficient cattle and that has helped us whenever we are crossing them with anything.”

“So many of these breeds now have got to where they are kind of discouraging crossbreeding, but it’s really hard to keep cattle fertile and keep them reproducing if you don’t use heterosis and crossbreeding,” Brown says. “These South Devons of course, anything you put them

with doesn’t have a lot of South Devon in it, so anything you cross them with, you’re going to get heterosis there.”

The breed seemed to sell itself and Brown says that MJB Ranch’s bull and female trade had been mostly developed by word of mouth and happy customers who have liked their results, told their colleagues and come back for more.

“We really feel fortunate to have gotten involved with the South Devon breed, of all the breeds that we worked with, we really liked them the best,” Brown says.

DNA Collection Brings Value

TO CATTLE PRODUCERS

Genomic testing is a growing practice in beef herd improvement, bringing cattle producers opportunities to manage breeding outcomes, elevate calf quality and increase reproductive efficiency.

It's like 23&Me for cattle, where progressive producers can look into important pedigree and breed backgrounds, and assess key production, maternal and carcass traits.

As an enabling technology, Allflex Tissue Sampling Units (TSU) make DNA collection faster, cleaner and easier than blood drops or hair follicles, which are messy and easily cross contaminated.

Allflex Tissue Sampling Units involve the deposit of a small ear punch into a vial, which seals the tissue in a liquid preservative and identifies it with a unique barcode. It takes mere seconds at chute side.

DNA labs handle TSUs robotically, speeding test result turnaround and increasing reliability.

On the farm or ranch, the best times to collect DNA samples are between birth and three months of age. By profiling cattle early, producers can sort them into replacement heifer or feeder calf groups sooner. Other times to collect samples are during cattle vaccination or when separating replacement heifers at weaning.

Parentage verification

Sire parentage will verify which bulls sire the best calves and those that are being pushed aside by more dominant bulls, as well as pinpoint bulls that are infertile or lack libido. Labs need sire and calf DNA to verify parentage.

Heterosis in crossbreds

New tools assess heterosis in crossbred replacement heifers. Heterosis strongly influences reproduction, wellness and growth, helping cow-calf producers fill their herd with productive, efficient F1 cows.

Genetic health

Genetic tests help producers identify defect carriers and breed them to non-carriers. This helps producers breed defects out of the herd as well as reduce death loss or aborted fetuses.

Feedlot qualities

New DNA indexes rank feedlot cattle on carcass and terminal traits. The data can help in sorting feeder cattle, selecting cattle for retained ownership in the finishing phase or raising beef for direct sale to consumers

Genomic profiling

Commercial cattle producers use DNA profiling to rate, rank and select replacement heifers based on maternal, production and carcass traits. Profiling the cow herd also helps pick out traits desired from new bulls or semen.

Persistent disease carriers

Tissue samples also are preferred for screening calves for persistent infection with bovine viral diarrhea virus (BVDV). Culling these calves reduces herd losses from sickness, abortions and death.

Seedstock EPDs

Seedstock breeders obtain EPDs for cows, donor dams, bull calves and heifers. By sending tissue samples to breed associations, DNA data facilitates genomically enhanced EPDs for greater accuracy in progeny predictions, particularly for yearling bulls.





2025 HALLMARK DAMS

The North American South Devon Association in continuing efforts to stress performance and productivity, recognizes the superior females of the breed, the Hallmark Dams. To identify these cows, emphasis was placed on early puberty, breeding, early calving and superior production over time. A Hallmark Dam is the standard by which all South Devon cows can be judged.

Hallmark Dams Criteria

1. Dams must have weaned a calf born since January 1, 2025.
2. Dams must be at least 50 percent South Devon and have had a minimum of three calves.
3. The maximum age for a dam to have had her first calf is 30 months of age.
4. A maximum calving interval of 395 days.
5. Every calf produced must have weaning records submitted.
